Today we are going to have a paraphrase of scripture. It's take from Luke 1, Matthew 1, and Luke 2.

Why these two gospels, because each gospel tells different parts of the story - emphasizing different aspects of the Good News. There two talk about Jesus' birth. John is more philosophical, and Mark skips straight to Jesus being an adult. Matthew tells of the universal event with Kings, Magi & stars in the heavens. Luke is more personal with Mary & shepherds.

Today Gabrielle will be delivering the messages - but be careful, God doesn't just stand and talk.

Pageant: Delivering the message Dear Lord, please bless these words and the meditations of our hearts. Amen.

G: Hello. I'm Gabriel(le), and I've got a lot to do. I need some helpers. Could all the little angels come and join me?

[kids come up]

Great.

God has decided it's time to try something amazing. As you know, God likes to involve people - and we've been asked to let them know about their part.

The first person we need to find is Zachariah. Both he and his wife Elizabeth are really good people. He's the minister in a church.

We need to find him... what's a minister wear? [a stole or like a special scarf]

Good.

Could you please find him and give him this letter. When he's done, I need you to bring it back.

[kids go and search with letter.]

Z: Oh, I've got mail. I wasn't expecting this. I wonder if I should open it? What do you think?

Okay, let's find out what it says.

Dear Zachariah and Elizabeth,

Don't be afraid. (hhmmm)

You two will be having a baby! You'll call him John (that's an odd choice) - and he will bring you great joy. He help a lot of people to focus back on the way God wants us to live. This is all to prepare the way for the Lord!

God bless Gabriel(le)

P.S. please give this message back after reading it.

This is ridiculous. I don't believe it. Just wait until I te... [Zs voice stops working]

G: Oh, Zachariah. You're usually so faithful, but sometimes God's plans are hard to understand. We'll give you some time to think about it... by taking away your voice until John is born.

Now little ones, come back here.

[kids come back]

We need to let six months pass. Let's spin around 6 times.

Okay. It's time for the next message. This one is going to Mary. I'm going to go in person, but can you help me find her? You'll recognize her because she's wearing a blue hijab.

G: [to the little angels]


Thank you.

Hello Mary. You are in for a treat. The Lord is with you. M:[look perplexed, or afraid, or both] G: Mary, please don't be afraid.

We're bringing you news of great joy.

You're going to have a baby! You'll call him Jesus, and he will be the Son of God. He will

be the best King ever - and be king forever.

M:[tap empty ring finger for G to see, raise eyebrows, lift hands & shrug shoulders to ask how this could happen]

G: True, you're not married yet. Don't worry about it, through God all things are possible. Just look at Elizabeth.

[Mary looks confused]

Oh, you didn't hear yet. Despite being really old, she's pregnant.

M:[clasp hands with excitement, bring them to your heart and bow your head in acceptance]

G: Thank you Mary.

[to little angels]

Okay, let's go back and find out what's next.

G: [open little envelop]

Joseph. Oh, this is important.

Joseph is Mary finance. They've been dreaming of getting married and starting a family. Sadly, Joseph found out already that Mary's pregnant and he's planning to leave her. Having a baby is hard. Mary & Jesus will need Joseph, and Joseph needs them too.

Okay, we need a plan. I think if we just show up Joseph might be too scared and have a heart attack. What could we do? ... Let's send a dream.

Joseph works hard in construction - and sometimes falls asleep without taking off his construction cloths. I'll get the dream sorted out, while you go <u>quietly</u> to find him, we don't want to wake him up, and then come back.

. . . Great.

Here's the parts of the dream. I need you to take them over and hold them by his head (but don't hit him, then he'll wake up and be scared).

[send sections of dreams one at a time]

1) Joseph, don't be afraid to get married to Mary

2) the baby is from the Holy Spirit

[wave to wee angels to come back quietly. As Angels going back, *Mary* starts going to Elizabeth]

G: Oh, look over there. Mary's visiting Elizabeth. They both see how much good God is doing by challenging their lives - and will also bring good by challenging the world.

And it looks like Mary is about to sing a song - let's hear/join.

[*Joseph* walks over to *Mary*. They hold hands and walk around the group back to their seats near the back of where people are sitting.]

G: Wow! Did you hear her sing about how God will be with the people who are struggling and need help? ...and that those who think they're so great, won't be so great.

She really gets it.

Still, just because God favours you doesn't mean life is going to be easy.

Let's see what will happen when Mary is very pregnant.

Let's spin around 8¹/₂ times.

So, when Mary is very pregnant, she & Joseph have to go on a big trip. The king of kings (as he calls himself), Ceasar Augustus, orders everyone to return to their home town to be counted. Joseph is from Bethlehem, so he and Mary have to go there. They are poor and have to walk. Lots of other people also have to go to, so when they get there...

there's no place to stay. Not with relatives. Not in hotels. Finally,

they find a spot.

It's nice and warm because there are lots of animals in their room - because they are in a barn. After a long and hard trip, laying in some warm hay, you might think Mary relaxes and falls asleep, but no. She relaxes and delivers a baby - The Baby - The Son of God has been born!

Now, who should we tell?

Somebody important? Somebody popular? Somebody no-body likes? or cares about?

[open little envelope and look at note inside]

Well, it seems God wants us to tell the night shepherds - the ones no-body likes or cares about.

What do Shepherds do? [look after sheep]

Right, so if we find the sheep we'll find the shepherds. Off you go. . .

[After hymn, Mary takes baby Jesus and walks around]

G: And this is how God chose to come into the world - as a little baby. Not able to talk to people yet, or even walk. God - but vulnerable, needing people, crying when poopy. Growing up at first as a refugee, then in an ordinary house and going to school.

And yet, Jesus grew up to be so much more than just an ordinary person. Jesus shows us what it can be like to live as God wants us to... even when it hurts.

And Jesus shows us that pain isn't the end - Joy is.

And more than just showing us how to live a good life, Jesus is how we can be saved from all the bad parts of ourselves. All those things we have done, or failed to do, that hurt others, the environment, and even ourselves... Jesus can bring healing, peace & love.

This is the way of the Lord.

The Holy Spirit was at work in this Christmas Pageant, creating a space in which we could interact with each other... and with God.

I read this week about another congregation that is exploring new ways of being church. We heard about them a couple of years ago when Jen deComb preached. The Well Church in Mississauga has always tried to be a space



for the 1.5 generation - those raised by immigrants, but in a Canadian context. They are in between.

With help from Presbyterians Sharing they have re-set their focus around spiritual formation. This has included worship, small groups, children's programs, and retreats. By focusing on spiritual formation and becoming more Christ-like, the congregation has not only grown closer as a community, but they also feel better equipped to share their personal stories of hope and transformation with friends and neighbours.

These are some ways the Holy Spirit is working in Kensington, and other congregations.




